Nephi writes in the ways of his Father Lehi which consists of two things...

First Verse of the Book of Mormon sets stage

1 Nephi 1:1

I, Nephi, having been born of goodly parents, therefore, I was taught somewhat in all the learning of my father.

And having seen many afflictions in the course of my days, nevertheless, having been highly favored of the Lord in all my days,

Yea, having had a great knowledge of the goodness and the mysteries of God,

Therefore, I make a record of my proceedings in my days.

Yea, I make a record in the language of my father, which consists of the learning of the Jews, and the language of the Egyptians;

Today we begin to discuss 'The Learning of the Jews'

Last Week....

This word is....El Shaddai

Hebrews Understood this 'to nourish'

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The word "האל" (teat) is often coupled with the word "האל" (mighty, strong) creating the phrase "האל" (el shaddai) literally meaning the "mighty teat," hence we can see the translator's reluctance to literally translate this phrase in this manner and instead using the more sanitized "God Almighty."
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Ancient word for God—who nourishes

Remember, Hebrews saw a pencil and thought not yellow object, but writes words (function).

El Shaddai appears only few times, one is in the blessing of JOSEPH (Nephi is a descendent of Joseph)

This is God referred to as El Shaddai—the one who nourishes

But what does Book of Mormon say??

1 Nephi 5

56 And we did travail and wade through much affliction in the wilderness; **And our women bore children** in the wilderness;

57 And so great were the blessings of the Lord upon us that while we did live upon raw meat in the wilderness,

our women did give plenty of suck for their children and were strong, yea, even like unto the men.

And they began to bear their journeyings without murmuring.

But what does Book of Mormon say??

1 Nephi 5:

58 And thus we see that the commandments of God must be fulfilled;

59 And if it so be that the children of men keep the commandments of God, <u>He doth nourish them and strengthen them</u> and provide ways and means whereby they can accomplish the thing which He hath commanded them;

60 Wherefore, He did provide ways and means for us while we did sojourn in the wilderness.

What we are reading is Parallelism

Note Parallelism.

Parallel of Physical to Spiritual

- (earthly) children
- (Eternal) tildren of Men

Parallel of Women and God

- Women and Breastmilk
- God's ancient name (El Shaddai—literally 'the breast' the one who nourishes)

Parallel of Breastmilk's Sufficiency

- bildren were completely nourished
- God@mpletely nourishes

El Shaddai conveyed the idea of SUFFICIENCY.

Total dependence, but total reliance without concern

Hebrew word for "Blameless" is an INFANT AT THE BREAST

Blameless, innocent, the one who is fed only from its mother's milk, is the one spiritual comparison to one that relies solely on our Heavenly Father, one who lives without sin.

Ancient Hebrew Word for Blameless is a child at the breast.

Notice King Benjamin's words use the definition:

Mosiah 1:122

And behold when that time cometh, none shall be found blameless before God, except it be little children,

Only through repentance and faith on the name of the Lord God Omnipotent.

Total Reliance

Nephi shares this as they are embarking on a journey of total reliance.

Parallel of Breastmilk's Sufficiency

- <u>fildren</u> were completely nourished
- <u>God</u>@mpletely nourishes

His response, our GOD IS TOTALLY SUFFCENT.

- A breastfeeding mother can not forget she has a nursing child.
- God can not forget to meet your needs.
- HE IS THE ONE WHO MAKES THIS COMPARISON of HIMSELF to prove to us his promise.

The Entire Book of Mormon Teaches Using Parallelism

The Entire Book of Mormon Teaches <u>Using</u> Parallelism

Not just parallel WORDS, but IDEAS

Notice the use of the word 'Parallel' (and all the parallels)

3 Nephi 11:33

...If they be **good**, to the **resurrection** of **everlasting life**, And if they be **evil**, to the **resurrection** of **damnation**, Being on a **parallel**.

The **one** on the **one hand**, and the **other** on the **other hand** – According to the **mercy** and the **justice** and the **holiness which is in Christ**, which was before the world began.

There must be a balance... with your ability to make unrestricted choice.

....Free Speech

Need to accept the possibility for unrighteousness in order to have righteousness.

We need to opposition in order to choose righteousness.

For me to live in a country where correct ideas can flow freely, need to be the ability to express dumb ideas, and need to accept it when they occur.

Lehi teaches truth deeper than we see on the surface

Opposition—First taught in context of punishment and happiness. Not physics.

Nevertheless, there was no law against a man's belief,

Here is the summary of life

There exists an opposition in all life. If is a fixed law BY GOD, You/We can't do anything about it.

Simultaneously, there is **NO LAW by GOD** against our belief. (This is more than just an American constitutional right, although you can see where the Founders were inspired on high)

So the challenge of this life becomes: to temper your belief within the boundaries of continual opposition.

Tempering your belief to the ways of GOOD is called (finding) the way.

 There can not be laws against belief or this would destroy the agency of man, but the WHOLE PLAN OF SALVATION. HUMANITY HAS TO BE FREE TO CHOOSE, THEN ALL JUDGMENT IS BASED ON THE OUTCOME OF YOUR CHOICES.

• Salvation has to be a free choice, likewise is damnation (free)

There exists an opposition always in this life. There is no law (eternal) dictating our belief.

All of life is if you choose to use your belief to guide you to the right.

We are FREE within the CONTINUAL OPPOSITION.

PARALLELISM

6.1 Introductory

Parallelism

Parallelism is universally recognised as the characteristic feature of biblical Hebrew poetry although it is also used extensively in kindred Semitic verse (notably Akkadian) as well as elsewhere. Most introductions to Hebrew poetry, for instance, Gray's The Forms of Hebrew Poetry, provide a brief description of parallelism and then proceed to give a detailed classification of its sub-types: synonymous, antithetic, synthetic and so on. My presentation here will be very different from the standard not simply to avoid dupliation or out of sheer love of novelty but because the study of parallelism has been affected, recently, on two levels, both related to theory. Accordingly, a few basic notions of theory with particular reference to parallelism

IT's the words, but its deeper than the words or literary style

No law on your mind, but your mind is in the middle of the forces. Teach it to yield to Gods force

Eve's words are important in IV, even though criticized by Evangelicals

- States if we hadn't sinned we wouldn't have known these things.
- But it is getting back to the deeper meaning the Hebrews understood that without tasting the bitter, you wouldn't know the sweet.

• Had to taste bitter to know the sweet.

Interpretting Book of Mormon Principles

- You will Experience Adversity in life.
- Your thoughts determine. There is no law against thoughts or will, it is free. But it determines outcome.
- It needs to be pulled to the left so you can determine to go to the right.
- There can be no north pole without a south pole.

What binds satan? Is it chains?

• Because of the righteousness of the saints satan has no power.

• Our will changes.

Good and Bad

Very few sermons in our Western synagogues and churches would include the passage "I [God] form the light and create darkness, I make peace and I create evil, I am the LORD who does all of these" (Isaiah 45:7) as our Western mind sees these two forces as opposing opposites. However, the Eastern mind sees them both as equals and necessary for perfect balance.

In the Western mind, God is only good and therefore unable to create evil. The Eastern mind sees God as a perfect balance of all things including good (tov in Hebrew, Strong's #2896) and evil (ra in Hebrew, Strong's #7451).

It should be noted that the English word "evil" has no Ancient Hebrew equivalent, while most English translations will use the word "evil," it is usually the Hebrew word ra, which is also often translated as "bad."

In the Ancient Hebrew mind there is no such thing as an "evil" person or thing. To understand the words "good" and "bad" from a more Hebraic understanding, these words should be understood as "functional" and "dysfunctional". God is both functional (such as seen in the@eation story of Genesis one) as well as dysfunctional (such as seen with the destruction of the flood).

Our western mind classifies all things in two categories, either it is "good" or it is "bad". One is to be sought, cherished and protected, the other is to be rejected, spurned and discarded. Let us take light and darkness as an example. We see light as good and darkness as bad. The idea of light brings to mind such things as God, truth and love. Darkness on the other hand invokes Satan, lies and hate. To the Orientals, including the Hebrews, both are equally nécessary as one cannot exist without the other. In the Bible God is seen as a God of light as well as darkness "And the people stood at a distance and Moses approached the heavy darkness where God was." (Exodus 20:21). If you stare at the sun, which is pure light, what happens? You become blind. If you are standing in a sealed room with no light, what happens? You are again blind. Therefore, both light and darkness are bad and yet, both are good. In order to see we must block out some of the light as well as some of the darkness.

The two poles of a magnet are north and south. These two poles create balance, they are not morally good or bad, but necessary ingredients of physics that compliment each other. Good and bad are more like the north and south poles of a magnet than our Western conception of good and bad.

Notice what Benner says...

Can good exist without the bad?

Absolutely not, how could you judge <u>something to be good if you</u> <u>cannot compare it to something bad?</u> The same is true for all other concepts. Cold cannot exist without heat, or short without tall, far without near, or large without small. <u>Our western mind usually ignores these extremes and seeks to always find the "good" or the "bad". The Eastern mind is continually seeking both the "good" and the "bad" in order to find the balance between the two. Even Solomon recognized this when he said "*Do not be overly righteous*" (Ecclesiastes 7:16).</u>

He describes the mind of the Hebrews.

Now notice book of Mormon...how could this not be written by a Hebrew.

To take name in vain

What does it mean for Yahweh to be *ehhad*? Yahweh manifests himself in many different ways. He is the cloud that leads the Israelites through the wilderness providing them shade from the hot sun. He is also the fire that leads them providing them with light and heat at night. He is the destroyer and the savior. He is the prosecutor and the defender. Each attribute of Yahweh is a unit, and each unit manifests itself in different ways, but they all work together to form a "unity" in the same way that all the individual units of a bicycle work together in unity, allowing the bicycle to function properly. In Zechariah 14:9 it states that Yahweh's "name is ehhad." The Hebrew word for "name" is) שש shem, Strong's #8034), which has the more Hebraic meaning of "character." Yahweh's "character" is ehhad, meaning that Yahweh will always work in unity with himself. The next time someone asks you what God's name is, you can say, "His name is *Ehhad*!"
