<u>In our Sin</u>—suggests he takes us out with no change from us when we realize we are sinful. This is NOT the Gospel.

<u>From our Sin</u>—He has power to remove the sin based on our response. Our 'Response' is to CHANGE OUR WILL.

259 And seeing that the hearts of the people began to wax hard and that they began to be offended because of the strictness of the word, His heart was exceeding sorrowful;

260 Therefore, he caused that his sons should be gathered together, That he might give unto them, every one, his charge separately concerning the things pertaining unto righteousness.

261 And we have <u>an account of his</u> commandments which he gave unto them, according to his own record.

Intro: The commandments of Alma to his son Coreanton.

1 And now my son, I have somewhat more to say unto thee than what I said unto thy brother;

For behold, have ye not observed the steadiness of thy brother, his faithfulness and his diligence in keeping the commandments of God?

2 Behold, has he not set a good example for thee?

3 For thou didst not give so much heed unto my words as did thy brother among the people of the Zoramites.

4 Now this is what I have against thee –

Thou didst go on unto boasting in thy strength and thy wisdom.

5 And this is not all, my son Thou didst do that which was grievous unto me,

For thou didst forsake the ministry

and did go over into the Land of Siron, among the borders of the Lamanites, after the harlot Isabel;

Yea, she did steal away the hearts of many;

But this was no excuse for thee, my son;

6 Thou shouldst have <u>tended to the ministry</u> wherewith thou wast entrusted.

7 Know ye not, my son, that these things are an abomination in the sight of the Lord?

Yea, most abominable above all sins,

save it be the shedding of innocent blood or denying the Holy Ghost.

8 For behold, if ye deny the Holy Ghost when it once hath had place in you – And ye know that ye deny it – Behold, this is a sin which is unpardonable.

9 Yea, and whosoever murdereth against the light and knowledge of God, it is not easy for him to obtain forgiveness.

Yea, I say unto you my son, that it is not easy for him to obtain a forgiveness!

10 And now my son, I would to God that ye had not been guilty of so great a crime;

11 I would not dwell upon your crimes to harrow up your soul, if it were not for your good;

12 But behold, <u>ye cannot hide your crimes from God</u>, And except ye repent, they will stand as a testimony against you at the last day.

13 Now my son,

I would that ye should repent and forsake your sins

and go no more after the lusts of your eyes, but cross yourself in all these things,

For except ye do this, ye can in no wise inherit the kingdom of God;

14 O remember, and take it upon you and cross yourself in these things.

15 And I command you to take it upon you to counsel your elder brothers in your undertakings.

For behold, thou art in thy youth and ye stand in need to be nourished by your brothers; 16 And give heed to their counsel;

Suffer not yourself to be led away by any vain or foolish thing,

Suffer not that the devil lead away your heart again after those wicked harlots.

17 Behold, O my son, how great iniquity ye brought upon the Zoramites!

For when they saw your conduct, they would not believe in my words.

18 And now the Spirit of the Lord doth say unto me:

Command thy children to do good, lest they lead away the hearts of many people to destruction."

19 Therefore, I command you, my son, in the fear of God, that ye refrain from your iniquities.

That ye turn to the Lord with all your mind, might and strength.

That ye lead away the hearts of no more to do wickedly;

20 But rather <u>return unto them</u> and <u>acknowledge your faults</u> and <u>retain that wrong which ye have done</u>.

Seek not after riches nor the vain things of this world,

For behold, you cannot carry them with you.

21 And now my son, I would say somewhat unto you concerning the coming of Christ -

22 Behold, I say unto you that

it is He that surely shall come

to take away the sins of the world,

Yea, He cometh to declare glad tidings of salvation unto His people.

23 And now my son, this was the ministry unto which ye were called –

To declare these glad tidings unto this people, To prepare their minds, or rather, that salvation might come unto them,

that they may prepare the minds of their children to hear the word at the time of His coming.

112 And now my son,
I desire that ye should let these things trouble
you no more.

And only let your sins trouble you with that trouble which shall bring you down unto repentance.

113 O my son, I desire that ye should deny the justice of God no more;

114 Do not endeavor to excuse yourself in the least point because of your sins, by denying the justice of God, But do you let the justice of God and His mercy and His longsuffering have full sway in your heart, But let it bring you down to the dust in humility.

115 And now O my son, ye are called of God to preach the word unto this people.

116 And now, my son, go thy way; Declare the word with truth and soberness, that thou mayest bring souls unto repentance, That the great plan of mercy may have claim upon them.

117 And may God grant unto you even according to my word. Amen.

Lessons from Coreantun— Beautiful principle of repentance, reconciliation, forgiveness.

- Serious offense
- Would not believe my words...people who have left the church.
- (Fathers) Don't lose sight of objective
- But dealt with by someone who was also a serious offender.
- Knows what it is like to rebel, but also knows the sweetness of forgiveness.
- · Teaches why the sin was wrong
- Recognize the right way
- Own the sin
- Make it right.
- Get back on course
- The son not ostracized, rejected.
- THE SON RETURNS TO THE MISSION FIELD.
- What can church learn from this?

Why be Merciful in Forgiving Others? Because of God's Mercy Demonstrated to Us

Mosiah 11:139

Yea, and as often as My people repent will I forgive them their trespasses against Me;

14 Said unto them, Ye have brought this man unto me, as one that perverteth the people: and, behold, I, having examined him before you, have found no fault in this man touching those things whereof ye accuse him:

15 No, nor yet Herod: for I sent you to him; and, lo, nothing worthy of death is done unto him.

16 I will therefore chastise him, and release him.

17 (For of necessity he must release one unto them at the feast.)

18 And they cried out all at once, saying, Away with this man, and release unto us Barabbas:

Hebrew Bar=Son, Abba=Father
"Son of the Father"

Barabbas represents all the Children of Men

19 (Who for a certain sedition made in the city, and for murder, was cast into prison.)

20 Pilate therefore, willing to release Jesus, spake again to them.

21 But they cried, saying, Crucify him, crucify him.

22 And he said unto them the third time, Why, what evil hath he done? I have found no cause of death in him: I will therefore chastise him, and let him go.

23 And they were instant with loud voices, requiring that he might be crucified. And the voices of them and of the chief priests prevailed.

24 And Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they required.

25 And he released unto them him that for sedition and murder was cast into prison, (Barabbas son of man)

whom they had desired;

but he delivered Jesus to their will. (son of God)

7 And he shall take the two goats, and present them before the LORD at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.

24 And Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they required.

25 And he released unto them him that for sedition and murder was cast into prison, whom they had desired; but he delivered Jesus to their will.

Leviticus 16:

8 And <u>Aaron shall cast lots upon the two goats; one</u> <u>lot for the LORD, and the other lot for the scapegoat</u>.

9 And Aaron shall bring the goat upon which the LORD's lot fell, and offer him for a sin offering.

10 But the goat, on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat,

shall be presented alive before the LORD, to make an atonement with him,

and to let him go for a scapegoat into the wilderness.

15 Then shall he kill the goat of the sin offering, that is for the people,

and bring his blood within the vail,

and do with that blood as he did with the blood of the bullock,

and sprinkle it upon the mercy seat, and before the mercy seat:

16 And he shall make an atonement for the holy place,

because of the uncleanness of the children of Israel, and because of their transgressions in all their sins:

21 And Aaron shall lay both his hands upon the head of the live goat,

and confess over him all the iniquities of the children of Israel,

and all their transgressions in all their sins, putting them upon the head of the goat,

and shall send him away by the hand of a fit man into the wilderness:

26 And as they led him away,

they laid hold upon one Simon a Cyrenian, coming out of the country,

and on him they laid the cross,

that he might bear it after Jesus.

27 And there followed him a great company of people,

and of women which also bewailed and lamented him.

32 And there were also <u>two other malefactors</u>, <u>led with him to be put to death</u>.

33 And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified him and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left.

34 Then said Jesus, <u>Father</u>, <u>forgive them</u>; <u>for they know not what they do</u>.
And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.

35 And the people stood beholding.

And the rulers also with them derided him, saying,

He saved others; let him save himself if he be Christ, the chosen of God

39 And one of the malefactors which were hanged railed on him, saying,

If thou be Christ, save thyself and us.

40 But the other answering rebuked him, saying,

Dost not thou fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?

41 And we indeed justly;

for we receive the due reward of our deeds.

But this man hath done nothing amiss.

42 And he said unto Jesus,

Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom.

43 And Jesus said unto him,

Verily I say unto thee,

Today shalt thou be with me in paradise.

40 And now concerning this space of time — What becometh of the souls of men is the thing which I have inquired diligently of the Lord to know,

And this is the thing of which I do know;

41 And when the time cometh when all shall rise, then shall they know that God knoweth

all the times which are appointed unto man.

42 Now concerning the state of the soul between death and the resurrection -

44 And then shall it come to pass that the spirits of those which are righteous are received into a state of happiness which is called paradise

- a state of rest, a state of peace –

Where they shall <u>rest from all their troubles</u> and from all care and sorrow, etc.

45 And then shall it come to pass that the spirits of the wicked, yea, which are evil –

For behold, they <u>have no part nor portion of the Spirit of the Lord,</u>

For behold, they chose evil works rather than good,

Therefore, the spirit of the devil did enter into them and take possession of their house -

46 And these shall be <u>cast out into outer</u> darkness;

There shall be weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth,

And this because of their own iniquity,

being led captive by the will of the devil.

47 Now this is the state of the souls of the wicked, yea, in darkness,

And a state of awful, fearful, looking for, of the fiery indignation of the wrath of God upon them;

Thus they remain in this state,

as well as the righteous in paradise,

until the time of their resurrection.

(Notice Parallels of Paradise and Outer Darkness)

The Thief on the Right--Who Goes to Paradise?

44 And then shall it come to pass that the spirits of those which are righteous are received into a state of happiness which is called paradise

- a state of rest, a state of peace –

Where they shall <u>rest from all their troubles</u> and from all care and sorrow, etc.

The Thief on the Right

- Fears God --because he is asking other thief if he doesn't fear God.
- Recognizes this 'man' Jesus-- must be connected to Deity.
- Sorrow for his sins?
- Recognizes that Jesus didn't deserve to die
- Recognizes his/our punishments are just
- Exhibits a heart changed.
- Demonstrates being Broken and Contrite

Acknowledging Unworthiness

Alma 18:16 Do not say,

"O God, I thank Thee that we are better than our brethren, "

But rather say,

"O Lord, **forgive my unworthiness** and remember my brethren in mercy" –

Yea, acknowledge your unworthiness before God at all times.

Whoso Cometh to Me...

3 Nephi 4:50

And whoso cometh unto Me with a broken heart and a contrite spirit, him will I baptize with fire and with the Holy Ghost,

Even as the Lamanites

because of their faith in Me at the time of their conversion, were baptized with fire and with the Holy Ghost,

And they knew it not.

Ammon/Lamoni, The Father of Lamoni, Lamanites Bury Swords, Lehi/Nephi in Prison, Anti-Nephi-Lehis.

ALL WERE BAPTIZED BY HOLY GHOST—hearts changed—before water baptism.

What is the Difference?

3 Nephi 3:14

Some were <u>lifted up in pride</u>,
and others <u>were exceeding humble</u>;
Some did <u>return</u> railing for railing,
while others would <u>receive</u> railing and persecution
and all manner of afflictions
and would not turn and revile again,

but were humble and penitent before God.

Thoughts

- The point is that all humanity will die whether good or evil.
- The more righteous go to paradise. The more righteous are described as 'those who didn't stone the prophets.' vs it does not say more righteous are only those who were baptized. What could this imply. God is merciful.
- Does not mean the 'gate' doesn't exist.
- Don't fall into a premise that doesn't exist.
- Paradise is not about only baptism so much as the change of heart
- They want to use it to suggest non importance of baptism
- Recognizing jesus, fearing god, recognized his own sin, his unworthiness. That is walking in the way.
- All humanity is divided the righteous from the unrighteous in the example of the cross.
- If you know to fear god and walk in the way and do not, then you are already walking in rebellion.

The (blank) Righteous

3 Nephi 4:41 "O all ye that are spared because ye were more righteous than they!

Will ye not now return unto Me and repent of your sins and be converted, that I may heal you?

The (blank) Righteous when Jesus Visits the Nephites

3 Nephi 4:66

And it was the more righteous part of the people which were saved,

And it was they which received the prophets and stoned them not,

And it was they which had not shed the blood of the saints which were spared;

Behold I Make ALL THINGS NEW

3 Nephi 5:92

Old **things** are done away and **all things have become new.**

Therefore, I would that ye should be perfect even as I or your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

Evidenced in their Laws....Even their Covenant

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3 Nephi 3:69 (PRE-JESUS ARRIVAL)

Therefore, there were ordained of Nephi men unto this ministry, that all such as should come unto them should be baptized with water,

And this as a witness and a testimony before God and unto the people that they had repented and received a remission of their sins;

Evidenced in their Laws....Even their Covenant

3 Nephi 9:12

And it came to pass that **Nephi went down into the water and was baptized**,

(NEPHI WAS BAPTIZED ANEW. AND EVERYONE ELSE. WHY? BECAUSE GOD MADE ALL THINGS NEW. HE SPOKE IT.

EVERYONE CAME INTO THE NEW COVENANT.
Who would not (have wanted) to be Baptized?

At Millennium....We Hear these words...

Ether 6:9

And there shall be a **new heaven and a new earth**; And they shall be like unto the old, save the old have passed away and **all things have become new.**

(DC 28:6c for all old things shall pass away, and all things shall become new, even the heaven and the earth, and all the fullness thereof, both men and beasts, the fowls of the air, and the fishes of the sea;

DC 63:13c yea, and blessed are the dead that die in the Lord from henceforth, when the Lord shall come, and old things shall pass away, and all things become new.)
