The 4 Levels of Hebrew Scripture

- Rabbi's divide Hebrew scripture on four levels:'
- 1. Sod (Tio ,(the deepest, perhaps hardest to understand. The word means "Secret" ("mystery") this scripture may come as inspiration or revelation with deep, harder to understand meanings.
- 2. Derash (דְּרֵשׁ (from Hebrew darash, means to "inquire" ("seek"). Derash is thoughtful, deep scripture, (the homiletical interpretation) but with meaning not shrouded in mystery.
- 3. Remez (רֶמֶז" (hints", this scripture is allegorical, giving hints of meaning through easier to understand symbols.

The 4 Levels of Hebrew Scripture

- Rabbi's divide Hebrew scripture on four levels:'
- **4. Peshat** (פְּשָׁט'-- (**plain** sense' literal or straight forward. The word literally meant <u>'to flatten out.'</u> Scripture taught in Peshat is taught in 'plainness' and leaves little room for misunderstanding or error in interpretation.

• The 4th Level **Peshat** is <u>TO SPEAK PLAINLY</u> or in <u>PLAINNESS.</u>

TYPES OF PARALLELISM IN HEBREW POETRY

1. Synonymous Parallelism

The second line repeats the first line.

2. Antithetical Parallelism

The second line contrasts with the first line.

3. Synthetic Parallelism

The second line adds to the first line.

4. Climactic Parallelism

The successive lines build to a climax.

5. Emblematic Parallelism

The figure of speech is explained in the second line.

6. Alternate Parallelism

The 3rd line repeats the 1st and the 2nd the 4th - ABAB.

7. Chiastic Parallelism

The 1st and 2nd lines are reversed in 3rd and 4th - ABBA.

PARALLELISM

6.1 Introductory

Parallelism

Parallelism is universally recognised as the characteristic feature of biblical Hebrew poetry although it is also used extensively in kindred Semitic verse (notably Akkadian) as well as elsewhere. Most introductions to Hebrew poetry, for instance, Gray's The Forms of Hebrew Poetry, provide a brief description of parallelism and then proceed to give a detailed classification of its sub-types: synonymous, antithetic, synthetic and so on. My presentation here will be very different from the standard not simply to avoid dupliation or out of sheer love of novelty but because the study of parallelism has been affected, recently, on two levels, both related to theory. Accordingly, a few basic notions of theory with particular reference to parallelism

Other Hebrew Grammar Characteristics: Double word meaning

Use of same word as Noun and Verb in same verse.

Example: 1 Nephi 2:41

Lehi says 'Behold I have dreamed a dream.'

Dreamed—Verb

A Dream—Noun.

...But Book of Mormon Critics state Plagiarism because Joseph says the same words in the Bible.

<u>Double Word:Book of Mormon extends into a staircase parallelism</u>

Use of same word as Noun and Verb in same verse

1 Nephi 2:41 And it came to pass that while my father tarried in the wilderness, he spake unto us, saying:

The PLAIN Book of Mormon Baptism Question

Mosiah 9:40

Yea, and are willing to **mourn** with those that **mourn**, Yea, and comfort those that stand in need of comfort, And to stand as witnesses of God at all times and in all things and in all places that ye may be in, even until death? That ye may be redeemed of God and be numbered with those of the first resurrection, that ye may have eternal life.

(Elipsis)

Baptism Principle #1: Baptism is a <u>Witness you are WILLING</u>

Mosiah 9:39 "And now as ye are desirous to come into the fold of God and to be called His people, And are willing to bear one another's burdens, that they may be light,

Anaphora

Several consecutive lines may begin with the same word or phrase.

An excellent example is **Psalm 150**

- 1 <u>Praise ye the Lord</u>. Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in the firmament of his power.
- 2 Praise him for his mighty acts; praise him according to his excellent greatness.
- 3 <u>Praise him</u> with the sound of the trumpet; praise him with the psaltery and harp.
- 4 <u>Praise him</u> with the timbrel and dance; praise him with stringed instruments and organs.
- 5 Praise him upon the loud cymbals; praise him upon the high-sounding cymbals.
- 6 Let everything that hath breath <u>praise the Lord</u>. Praise ye the Lord.

Cataphora (Epiphora)

Per Adele Berlin (Hebrew Scholar):

Consecutive lines end with the same word or phrase. This is rare in the Hebrew Bible and may be considered incidental.

Example is <u>Isaiah 40</u>

13 Who hath directed the Spirit of the LORD,

or being his counseller hath taught him?

14 With whom took he counsel, and who instructed him?

And taught him in the path of judgment, and taught him knowledge,

and shewed to him the way of understanding?

<u>Anadiplosis</u>

The first line ends and the second line begins with the same word

Example Ps 96:12-13

12 Let the field be joyful,

and all that is therein.

Then shall all the trees of the wood rejoice before the Lord,

for he is coming.

For he is coming to judge the earth.

He will judge the world with righteousness

and the people with his truth.

<u>Staircase</u>

Successive Lines contain increasing intensity or explanation.

Example Ps 77:16-17

The waters saw thee, O God,

The waters saw thee they were afraid,

The <u>depths also were troubled</u>.

The clouds poured out water,

Staircase Parallelism—of Baptism 1 Nephi 3:11-12

And my father said

The whole passage is a chiasm on

- the truth of the coming
- the signs of his coming

- the purpose of his coming (the great plan vs <u>perish</u>)
- Who is coming
- When he is coming.

- The Book of Mormon contains no words by chance.
- These words are Finely Machined, ordered by master craftsmen who were washedover by God's Holy Spirit to convey words and truth of the Almighty.
- These are the choicest words chosen, selected, arranged to within 1/10,000 of a spiritual inch to convey exact meaning to us—IN PLAINNESS.
- In the end, a shaft turns.
- I am like the employee in the sorting center, can recognize round and square, short and long.
- Couldn't begin to understand how they were designed and ordered, or the discipline of mind required for God to select the few overtime worthy to have written scripture.
- He Speaks According to our understanding, our language.

We don't need to know the origins, and precision if we understand the basic message.

Hebrew Scholar Jeff Benner...

"To Sin is To MISS THE MARK"

The Hebrew word for "sin" is חטאה hhatah, (Strong's #2403) and literally means "miss the mark"

The Word "Trample"

.....perfectly explains the Ancient Hebrew Meaning within the Book of Mormon

Trample...

Many times our modern culture can influence definitions of words in a way not intended by the original author. The Bible often refers to the keeping and breaking God's commands and covenant. To "keep" the commands of God is generally understood as to "obey" the commands, but this is not completely true since the Hebrew word "shamar"

() literally means to guard or protect.

The breaking of the commands is understood as "disobeying" but the Hebrew word "Parar" () literally means to trample underfoot).

Dictionary ~ Verbs

Hebrew
Scholar Jeff
Benner...
Explains 'to
Trample'

Each Hebrew word is a picture of action. In this case, the picture is an ox treading on the grain on the threshing floor to open up the hulls to remove the seeds. To the Ancient Hebrews, breaking the commands of Elohiym was equated with throwing it on the ground and trampling on it. A child who disobeys his parents, but is genuinely apologetic, shows honor and respect to his parents. But a child who willfully disobeys with no sign of remorse has trampled on his parents teachings and deserves punishment.

Book of Mormon defines Trample in Staircase/Emblematic Parallelism—<u>matches</u> Hebrew Perfectly.

1 Nephi 5:232-235

For the things which some men esteem to be of great worth both to the body and soul, others set at naught and trample under their feet;

Yea, even the very God of Israel do men trample under their feet;

I say trample under their feet, but I would speak in other words:

Book of Mormon important Baptism Parallelism

• Life of the Body and Life of the Spirit is a if not THE major parallelism within the Book of Mormon.

Baptism symbolically represents that parallel in all aspects.

 What other book (and any other denomination) stresses BOTH the baptism by water and the Holy Ghost by specific instructions and command other than those with Book of Mormon?

Is baptism a work and what is a work according to the Bible?

- A work is something we physically do.
- A good work would be anything conformed to the will of God in Christ (Eph.2:10).
- In Ephesians 2:8 is specifically says we are not save by works; salvation is "by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, NOT OF WORKS, lest anyone should boast."



Is baptism a work and what is a work according to the Bible?

A work is something that is physically done to accomplish a task, which is seen.

Belief, faith is exercised without lifting a finger.

The Bible emphatically states that we are not saved by works.

If we were, we would surely boast in ourselves, just as it says in Ephesians 2.



Is baptism considered a work? Absolutely.

Another person is required to be there, and both participate in a physical activity; it is a ceremony. In the Old Testament people's sins were covered by faith, but they had to do a work with their faith in order to show their faith - they had to sacrifice.



Forgiveness from God and reconciliation with Him involved a blood sacrifice.

A person bought an animal to the high priest, as a mediator he would then sacrifice the animal to the Lord.

In the New Testament Jesus, our high priest has done this for us and we only need to exercise faith in his one time act.



 Baptism is a physical work of man, this is why is not part of the gospel that says we are save by grace through faith. In other words we depend on what work another did for us to be saved, God through Christ. Faith is what the heart and mind agree on, what Jesus did already for us. We trust in His work for us.



• "we are NOT saved by WORKS" (Eph. 2:8), even those we are commanded to do. Those who say baptism is necessary for our salvation do not see it as a work. So the definition of what is a work, and the works of the law, must be understood.



 A work is any physical, religious ceremonial or moral activity that would be required for a believer to gain salvation, to be justified.
 Works of the law are those things specifically mentioned in the Old Covenant Law of Moses.



- Paul writes of Israel in Rom. 9:31-33: "but Israel, pursuing the law of righteousness, has not attained to the law of righteousness. Why? Because they did not seek it by faith, but as it were, by the works of the law. For they stumbled at that stumbling stone."
- Jesus was the stone the builders rejected.



Baptism is put in the same category as any work. What if someone believes the gospel, that Jesus died for their sins but also feels they must be baptized. That is adding works.



Ancient Hebrew Definition of Innocent

1318) → NQ) ac: Suckle co: **Breast** ab: **Innocent:** The pictograph $^{\varsigma}$ is a picture of a seed and represents the sons of the next generation, the — is a picture of the sun at the horizon and the drawing in of light. Combined these mean "child drawn in". The bringing in and holding close of an infant to the breast.

Innocent=BLAMELESS, INNOCENT, CLEAN

Innocent: Where the infant suckles.

Words NOT appearing in King James

- Innocence does NOT appear in King James.
- Guiltless does, and in an interesting context in NT. Means without sin.

Matthew 12:

(story of shewbread)

6 But I say unto you, That in this place is one greater than the temple.

7 But if ye had known what this meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice, ye would not have condemned the guiltless.

8 For the Son of man is Lord even of the sabbath day.

Innocence

The Book of Mormon uses 'INNOCENCE' describing Adam/Eve's nature Pre-Sin.

2 Nephi 1:113 And they would have had no children; Wherefore, they would have remained in a state of **innocence** - having no joy, for they knew no misery, doing no good, for they knew no sin.

Guiltless—without SIN

Mosiah 2:42

(context: sharing with the poor, not coveting possessions)

And now for the sake of these things which I have spoken unto you - that is,

for the sake of retaining a remission of your sins from day to day, that ye may walk guiltless before God

Guiltless—without SIN

3 Nephi 12:29

And it shall come to pass that whoso repenteth and is baptized in My name shall be filled;

And if he endureth to the end, Behold, him will I hold guiltless before My Father at that day when I shall stand to judge the world;

Guiltless—without SIN

Mormon 3:29

And He hath brought to pass the redemption of the world,

Whereby he that is found guiltless before Him at the judgment day hath it given unto them to dwell in the presence of God in His kingdom,

To sing ceaseless praises with the choirs above unto the Father and unto the Son and unto the Holy Ghost, which is one God, in a state of happiness which hath no end.

And All these MATCH the Ancient Hebrew for Sinless.

Jesus' Blood Atones for these Three:

- Those who kept the commandments, in Covenant
- Those who knew no law
- Little Children

(Abinadi's teaching: Mosiah 8)

1. Those Who Obeyed

Mosiah 8:

56 And now, the resurrection of all the prophets and all those that have believed in their words, or all those that have kept the commandments of God,

These shall come forth in the first resurrection;

Therefore, they are the first resurrection;

1. Those Who Obeyed

Mosiah 8:

57 They are raised to dwell with God who hath redeemed them, Thus they have eternal life through Christ who hath broken the bands of death.

2. Those Who Knew No Law

Mosiah 8:

58 And there are those who have part in the first resurrection, And these are they that have died before Christ came, in their ignorance, not having salvation declared unto them;

2. Those Who Knew No Law

Mosiah 8:

59 And thus the Lord bringeth about the restoration of these (i.e. those who knew no law);

And they have a part in the first resurrection, or hath eternal life, being redeemed by the Lord.

2. Those Who Knew No Law

Moroni 8:25

For behold that **all little children are alive** in Christ, and also all they that are without the law;

(Notice Moroni captures those who knew no law here as well)

3. Little Children

Mosiah 8:

60 And little children also hath eternal life.

The Best Scripture regarding the Innocent State of Children comes from Jesus in BOTH New Testament and Book of Mormon

Moroni 8:9

Behold, I came into the world, not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance;

The whole need no physician, but they that are sick;

Wherefore, little children are whole,

for they are not capable of committing sin;

Wherefore, the curse of Adam is taken from them in Me,

that it hath no power over them;

And the law of circumcision is done away in Me.'

Moroni 8:13 But little children are alive in Christ, even from the foundation of the world; If not so, God is a partial God, and also a changeable Being and a respecter to persons; For how many little children have died without baptism?

Incorrect Understanding of Grace, Works in New Testament.

This is TYPICAL in many Gentile Christian Churches, especially the 'hyper Grace' movement.

NOTICE EVERY PERSON JUSTIFYING THEIR POSITION (BAPTISM OF INFANTS, NO BAPTISM REQUIRED, BAPTISM IS A WORK...)

ALL USE SCRIPTURE IN SOME FASHION.

BUT TAKE OUT OF CONTEXT, INFER NONEXISTENT MEANING, STRAW MAN ASSUMPTIONS....

GENERALIZATIONS... (PLAY VIDEO)

Incorrect Understanding of Grace, Works in New Testament.

These confuse the Law of Moses which which was also called 'The Law of Works.'

The whole law was done away. Paul refers to TWO kinds of works:

- 1. The Works of the Law of Moses (done away) and
- 2. The Works required by Christ.

Some incorrectly believe that salvation has nothing to do with works.

Our works could not bring about salvation, it took an infinite payment by God.

But our works demonstrate the change of heart, therefore we are judged by them.

We are COMMANDED to be about 'the Good WORKS' of Christ.

Baptism is not a "Work of the Law of Moses'

Rebutting the ignorance

Paul referred to the Works of the Law of Moses being done away.

Paul and Apostles refer to the Works of Faith being our response to Christ.

Notion: Baptism will seal your children with the parents in Eternity.

Answer: Book of Mormon teaches Children already have eternal life. Parents need to humble themselves as children already are.

Mosiah 1:118

But men drinketh damnation to their own souls, except they humble themselves and become as little children,

And believeth that salvation was and is and is to come, in and through the atoning blood of Christ, the Lord Omnipotent.

Notion: Little Children will go to Hell if not baptized.

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Moroni 8:18 "Behold, I speak with boldness, having authority from God; For I fear not what man can do; For perfect love casteth out all fear; And I am filled with charity, which is everlasting love;

Wherefore, all children are alike unto me; Wherefore, I love little children with a perfect love; And they are all alike and partakers of salvation;

Notion: Little Children have sin.

Answer: Book of Mormon teaches Children are sinless, not capable of sin.

Mosiah 1:114-115

And even if it were possible that little children could sin, they could not be saved;

But I say unto you, they are blessed; For behold, as in Adam, or by nature, they fall, even so the blood of Christ atoneth for their sins.

Notion: We are born into this word with the sin of Adam upon us.

Answer: Book of Mormon teaches we are only accountable for our own sin. We are all, however, born into a fallen world separated from God because of the action of our first parents.

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Why the Book of Mormon

Because Gentiles would STUMBLE

Why the Book of Mormon

Because Gentiles would STUMBLE.

Not trying to prove 'this is the restored church' but this is the restored doctrine that was given for all to plainly understand.

Scripture contains no righteous account of infant baptism, yet millions taught that it must be true.

Scripture contains first person Jesus commanding baptism, yet many Gentiles advocate it isn't necessary.

Use the incorrect understandings put forth by Luther and build a religion upon it that had no foundation in the original Apostles message.

Be aware

Not trying to demonstrate by scripture that this is God's true church, but in intellectual honesty, what makes most sense? What is plainest?

But becomes self evident

Beware

It seems the ENTIRE justification of 'children having sin' is an obscure statement that David was conceived in sin. (But David also writes of his child who died saying where he is, I will be too, so that cancels the idea that somehow he was arguing that all babies have sin. BUT THE ENTIRE CATHOLIC AND LUTHERAN WORLD REFERS TO THIS SCRIPTURE WHEN JUSTIFYING INFANT BAPTISM.

That is likely just another way to say, born into a sinful world.

But SIN is part of the SOUL, not the BODY.

SIN occurs with WILLFUL rebellion against that which is good.

Saying a body was born into a sinful world does not make it SINFUL by default, OTHERWISE JESUS WOULD HAVE BEEN BORN WITH SIN.

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Psalms 51:6

Beware --one single phrase is used throughout Catholicism to support children being born with sin. This scripture does not teach or imply this.

- 1 Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy lovingkindness: according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my transgressions.
- 2 Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight: that thou mightest be justified when thou speakest, and be clear when thou judgest.

5 Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.

- 6 Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward parts: and in the hidden part thou shalt make me to know wisdom.
- 7 Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

If Children are born with sin, then Jesus (who was conceived by an earthly mother) would have bestowed sin onto Jesus. NOT TRUE.

Saying a body was born into a sinful world does not make it SINFUL by default, OTHERWISE JESUS WOULD HAVE BEEN BORN WITH SIN. Likely no Christian on either side of the argument would claim that Jesus had sin at birth. It can't be reconciled otherwise Jesus would have been a sinner, which if true, negates the entire story of salvation—he was what the unblemished lamb represented.

Psalmist (David) who wrote Psalm 51 also claimed he would 'go' to where his infant was:

2 Samuel:

22 And he said, While the child was yet alive, I fasted and wept: for I said,

Who can tell whether GOD will be gracious to me, that the child may live?

23 But now he is dead, wherefore should I fast? can I bring him back again?

I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me.

David's understanding was

His child was with God in heaven.

David DID NOT imply in Psalm 51 that children are born with sin.

Rather, he acknowledges that from the beginning of life, we are surrounded by sin in this world.

Baptism Extremes

Infant Baptism

HAS to be done because

- Infants are sinners
- One can not received Gods gifts without baptism
- HAVE to be baptized otherwise go to hell.
- One becomes a Christian at the point of infinite baptism to delight God.

No Baptism of ANY Kind

- No baptism is necessary, just faith alone
- Any baptism is a work, and works are of man, therefore baptism is NOT necessary because WORKS do not save you.
- Baptism is a work offending God because ONLY faith is required.
- We become 'Christians' when we SAY we believe.

The Extremes

Satan plays both extremes to his advantage. This is the baptismal hedge.

SATAN deceives some to ENFORCE baptism therefore demand its application to the innocent. (And thereby Mock God's Grace).

SATAN deceives others to REJECT baptism, therefore demand its exclusion for any reason, stating saved by FAITH alone. (And thereby Mock God's Grace).
