Moroni 8:13 But little **children** are alive in **Christ**, even from the foundation of the world; If not so, God is a partial God, and also a changeable Being and a respecter to persons; For how many little children have died without baptism?

- Salvation is all about 'grace' not 'works'
- I just have to 'Believe in Jesus' and I am saved
- Works don't matter regarding salvation

What others say...about us?

(A question in a publication asks)..., "Is it true that because LDS reject the doctrine of salvation by faith alone, they are not Christians?"

(Response) The first mark of a cult is any group that multiplies works to salvation. Paul wrote in Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: Not of works."

This verse of scripture leaves no room for debate. You are saved only because of God's love (grace) for you. Paul adds in Galatians 2:21, "I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain."

When we answer this question using the Bible as the sole point of reference, we must say, "Yes, Mormons, you are not Christians, because you teach that Jesus, the cornerstone of the Christian faith, did not fully atone for our sins with His vicarious death on the cross."

Ephesians 2: The Chapter is a Chiasm...

A: Verses 1–3 (Past state: dead in sin, separated from God)

B: Verses 4–7 (God's grace intervenes, transforms us with Christ)

C: Verses 8–10 (Salvation by His Death instead of the Law of Moses

B': Verses 11–18 (Reconciliation overcomes past separation, unites us with God and each other)

A': Verses 19–22 (Present state: alive in God, part of His household)

Ephesians 2: The Chapter's Important Parallelism

The parallel compares the **Jewish practice of circumcision** (a human work to join the covenant) **and Christ's death** (God's work in the flesh, unasked for by humanity).

This contrast shows that grace and salvation come not from human efforts (like circumcision) but from Christ's sacrificial act, which unites all into a new covenant without our prompting.

Ephesians 2	Human-works	God's-works
Verses 8-9	No work of man	All Work of God
Verses 10-17	Humans made covenant with the flesh (circumcision)	God made covenant with His death.

The Parallelism Explained

Circumcision (Human Flesh): A physical, human act to enter God's covenant, it divided (Jew vs. Gentile) and relied on human obedience. It's powerless to save or unite.

Christ's Death (God's Flesh): God's unilateral act in Christ's body—unasked for by humanity—abolishes division, reconciles all to God (v. 16), and establishes peace (v. 17). True grace flows from this, not human effort.

In this Hebrew parallelism, Ephesians 2 contrasts the insufficiency of human works in the flesh with the all-sufficient work of God in Christ's flesh, culminating in a new, universal covenant of grace.

Paul Taught:

Galatians 2:16

Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law

But by the faith of Jesus Christ,

Even we have believed in Jesus Christ

That we might be justified by the faith of Christ

And not by the works of the law

For by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

Paul Taught:

Galatians 2:16

Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law (i.e. Torah),
But by the faith of Jesus Christ (i.e. faith),
Even we have believed in Jesus Christ (i.e. faith),
That we might be justified by the faith of Christ (brings to Mercy),
And not by the works of the law (salvation not by Law of Moses):
For by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified. (summary)

What did Paul teach in the New Testament?

 Obedience to the Law of Moses didn't bring salvation but Obedience to Christ

Obedience to the Law of Moses (Works)
 Obedience to Christ (Faith)

What was 'The Law?'

Greek: Nomos

Hebrew: Torah

- 'The Law' was shorthand or Abreviation for 'The Law of Moses' to familiar audience.
- Torah was the Law Given to Moses of rules and regulations for every moment of life for an Old Testament Jew.

The Bible taught that the Law of Moses Pointed to Christ

Galatians 3:24

Wherefore the law (Torah) was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith (saved)

What states we have rights to Free Speech and to bear Arms?

What states we have rights to Free Speech and to bear Arms?

- The Constitution of the United States of America.
- Saying 'The Law' was a familiar abbreviation for those in the culture who already lived by The Law of Moses.

Many Bible Scriptures Teach this about the Law pointing to Christ AND being done away.

Romans 7:4 Wherefore, my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ; that ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto God.

Romans 10:4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth.

Galatians 3:19 ..., the law was added because of transgressions, till the seed should come to whom the promise was made in the law given to Moses, who was ordained by the hand of angels to be a mediator of this first covenant, (the law.)

Ephesians 2:15 Having **abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments** (*I.e. Mosaic Law*) contained in ordinances;

<u>II Corinthians 3:13</u>....the children of Israel could not steadfastly look to the end of that which is abolished (referencing the Law of Moses);

Paul Taught This but Many Jews Rebelled.

Christians today also rebel by taking Ephesians 2 out of context.

Acting on part of the story, without understanding the whole story.

Nephi understood Grace.

We first have to be Reconciled to Christ for Grace to be 'applied.'

2 Nephi 7:42

And remember, that after ye are reconciled unto God, That it is only in and through the **grace** of God that ye are saved;

Lehi understood Grace.

Salvation is only by the gift of God to die on the cross

2 Nephi 1:73

Wherefore, how great the importance to make these things known unto the inhabitants of the earth,

That they may know that there is no flesh that can dwell in the presence of God, save it be through the merits and mercy and grace of the Holy Messiah

Nephi explains Grace.

2 Nephi 1:72

Behold, He offereth Himself a sacrifice for sin (this is Grace)

to answer the ends of the law (law of Moses) unto all those which have a broken heart and a contrite spirit,

And unto none else can the ends of the law be answered.

Nephi explains Grace.

2 Nephi 8:7-12

- 7 Behold, my soul delighteth in proving unto my people the truth of the coming of Christ,
- 8 For, for this end hath the law of Moses been given;
- 9 And all things which have been given of God from the beginning of the world unto man are the typifying of Him.
- 10 <u>And also my soul delighteth</u> in the covenants of the Lord which He hath made to our fathers;
- 11 Yea, my soul delighteth in His grace and His justice and power and mercy, In the great and eternal plan of deliverance from death.
- 12 <u>And my soul delighteth</u> in proving unto my people that save Christ should come, all men must perish;

Nephi explains the Mosaic Law was Dead. Life came through Jesus.

2 Nephi 11:45-57

And notwithstanding we believe in Christ, We keep the **law**of Moses and look forward with steadfastness unto Christ until the **law**shall be fulfilled, For, for this end was the **law** given;

Wherefore, **the law hath become dead unto us**, And we are made alive in Christ because of our faith; Yet we keep the **law** because of the commandments;

Wherefore, we speak concerning the law, that our children may know the deadness of the law;

And they, by knowing the deadness of the law,

may look forward unto that **life** which is in Christ and know for what end the **law** was given;

And after that the law is fulfilled in Christ, that they need not harden their hearts against Him when the law had ought to be done away.

For the right way is to believe in Christ and deny Him not, For by denying Him ye also deny the prophets and the law.

And inasmuch as it shall be expedient, ye must keep the performances and ordinances of God until the law shall be fulfilled which was given unto Moses.

The Book of Mormon teaches Grace properly Applied.

Mosiah 8:9 "And now, did they understand the law?

Mosiah 8:10 I say unto you, nay, they did not all understand the law, and this because of the hardness of their hearts, For they understood not that there could not any man be saved, except it were through the redemption of God.

Mosiah 8:90 Therefore, if ye teach the law of Moses, also teach that it is a shadow of those things which are to come;

Alma 14:75 But notwithstanding the law of Moses, they did look forward to the coming of Christ, considering that the law of Moses was a type of His coming, And believing that they must keep those outward performances until the time that He should be revealed unto them.

Alma 14:76 Now they did not suppose that salvation came by the law of Moses, but the law of Moses did serve to strengthen their faith in Christ;

The Book of Mormon puts Grace in Perspective:

Moroni 10:29-30

Yea, come unto Christ and be perfected in Him and deny yourselves of all ungodliness,

And if ye shall deny yourselves of all ungodliness and love God with all your might, mind and strength, Then is His grace sufficient for you,

that by His grace ye may be perfect in Christ;

And if by the grace of God ye are perfect in Christ,

ye can in no wise deny the power of God.

And again, if ye by the grace of God are perfect in Christ and deny not His power,

Then are ye sanctified in Christ by the grace of God through the shedding of the blood of Christ,

Which is in the covenant of the Father unto the remission of your sins, that ye become holy without spot.

The Book of Mormon puts Grace in Perspective,

Grace is applied after we are reconciled to Christ. This by repentance and change of Heart.

Then Grace is applied according to our life (i.e. by our works)

Helaman 4:71

And may God grant in His great fullness

That men might be brought unto repentance and good works,

That they might be restored unto grace

For grace according to their works.

So...Ephesians 2:8-9 Teaches

- Salvation is not by the works of the Law of Moses but by the Works of Christ
- Humanities 'works' didn't bring us to salvation, but God's 'work'— which is freely choosing to die on our behalf. This is Grace.
- We were created to do Good works and for these we will be judged.
- Belief requires obedience, a heart changing and repentance from sin. This brings brokenness and contrition. THEN Grace is applied.
