

A problem with Words....

In ancient Hebrew, the terms <u>"soon" and "speedily" can convey the idea of imminence</u>, meaning that something is about to happen or will happen soon.

However, these terms can also convey the idea of assurance or certainty, indicating that something is guaranteed to happen, even if it may not happen immediately.

A problem with Words...."Soon" & "Speedily"

The Hebrew term for "soon" is "karov" קרוֹב, which can mean "near" or "close."

This term is often used to describe something that is expected to happen soon, but it can also indicate that something is certain to happen, even if the timing is not immediate.

Written by Nephi around 600 BC, these are all statements of guarantee, but not guarantees of immediacy.

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Zion??

Mount Zion is a hill in Jerusalem, located just outside the walls of the Old City.

The term Mount Zion is found in the Old Testament first for the City of David (2 Samuel 5:7, 1 Chronicle 11:5; 1 Kings 8:1) and later for the Temple Mount, but its meaning has shifted and it is now used as the name of ancient Jerusalem's Western Hill. In a broader sense, the term is also utilized for the entire Land of Israel.

In the Old Testament, the term "fight against Zion" is a symbolic reference to the struggle between the forces of evil and the people of God.

Over time, Zion came to represent not just the physical location, but the entire people of God and their spiritual inheritance.

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Jacob defines To 'FIGHT AGAINST ZION" is to fight against the covenants and promises God has made to restore Israel.

But the Early Saints used it to Justify a Gentile Dream in the 1830s...

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And it shall be said among the wicked, Let us not go up to battle against Zion, for the inhabitants of Zion are terrible, wherefore we can not stand.

The DC is describing a physical battle of likely Jackson County inhabitants,

But the source is Jacob describing worldwide fighting against the covenants.

Conclusion of Fighting against Zion...

The Book of Mormon describes fighting against the covenants God made to regather his people

Conclusion of Fighting against Zion...

The people writing 1830's revelations were reading from the Bible and Book of Mormon, and concluding all these events were immediately about to occur.

Some phrases within the revelations from Book of Mormon, but then were re-written in an 'immediate' context.

This created emotional excitement that persists today.

To have peace we need to relearn from the source, and remove the false paradigms.

1830's revelations were preparing all hearts for immediacy.

But the Book of Mormon prophets were writing of <u>the assurance</u> of the covenants.

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Two types of Parallelism: Antithetical and Janus

Antithetical—ideas oppose. Life and death, light and dark, etc.

2 Nephi 6:74

Remember, to be carnally minded is death, and to be spiritually - minded is life eternal.

Two types of Parallelism: Antithetical and Janus

Janus Parallelism—the same word with dual meaning.

Verse pivots on changed meaning of the word

(These are Elusive in the Bible. Identified in recent times, but harder to identify)

Alma 19:112

And now my son,

I desire that ye should let these things trouble you no more,

only <u>let your sins trouble you</u> with that <u>trouble</u> which shall bring you down unto repentance.

{For the Mighty God shall deliver His covenant people.} (This verse Not in King James)

<u>Complex Hebrew Authenticity of Jacob's complete</u> verse:

Jacob/Nephi's writing drives Home a larger message, larger than saints of 1830's believing Zion was then to be established.

But larger in that God has a mighty plan in Fulfilling His Covenants to ALL the House of Israel. Early saints wrote according to the Book of Mormon in part, but put their own timeline on it. That was not correct.

When Zion's promises are fulfilled, all the signposts must be fulfilled.

We can not will them to happen, they happen when God sees fit.

The prayers of the ancients were that their descendants hearts would return to God.
